



JRA youth have serious and acute service needs



JRA youth have complex co-occurring treatment needs




JRA tracks the frequency of 5 disorders illustrated in the left hand chart. The right hand chart shows that 58% of youth in JRA residential care and 75% of youth under parole supervision require service interventions for two, three, or four disorders.

Approximately 70% of youth with mental health issues received mental health services including hospitalization prior to commitment in JRA.


JRA Residential Care

Population Trends

- Caucasian, Asian, Native American, and Mixed Race percentages in the JRA population have all decreased since 2004.
- The percentages of African American and Hispanic youth have climbed.
- The proportion of African American youth in JRA residential care has increased by 26% since 2004, the proportion of Hispanic youth by 43%
- The increased proportion of African and Hispanic youth since 2004 has been great enough to have increased the overall proportion of minority youth in JRA by 12%, even with proportional decreases in all other minority categories.
