King County Prosecutor Dan Satterberg and Snohomish County Superior Court Judge Ellen Fair, SGC Commissioners, were appointed by Chairman Dave Boerner to review the crime of Assault of a Child in the First Degree, pursuant to a directive in the Eryk Woodruff Public Safety Act of 2009 (HB 2279). The commission will discuss the recommendation and take final action in the November meeting.

V. SEX OFFENDER POLICY BOARD – DISCUSSION

Sex Offender Policy Board Chairman Russ Hauge and Commissioner Mary Ellen Stone will report to the Commission on the progress of the Board after its first year of operation.
