

## Impact of Community Protection Zones

3,193 CCB sentences were given between 2002 and 2013. 2,970 of them were convicted of Class A offenses. According to the ISRB June, 2011 Statistical Report, approximately 70% of CCB/Determinate Plus offenders are convicted of Rapes of a Child 1 or 2 or Child Molestation 1. Community Protection Zones apply to all CCB sentences against minors, but these Class A offenses are the biggest percentage. So we can say that approximately 70% of the 3,193 CCB offenders, or roughly 16% of the approximately 18,000 registered sex offenders, are subject to community protection zone residency restrictions. This would mean about 2,300 – 2,400 of the registered sex offenders in Washington are subject to Community Protection Zone restrictions.
