23-25 Legacy System Remediation (LSR) Funding

Proviso for tech pool

(i) ((\$41,000,000)) \$64,780,000 of the information technology system development revolving account—state appropriation is provided solely for a technology pool ((in fiscal year 2024)) to pay for phase 1A (agency financial reporting system replacement—core financials) state agency costs due to legacy system remediation work associated with impacted financial systems and interfaces. The office of financial management must manage the pool, authorize funds, track

1 costs by agency by fiscal month, and report after each fiscal month 2 close on the agency spending to the consolidated technology services 3 agency so that the spending is included in the statewide dashboard 4 actual spending;

Agencies must provide a narrative, explaining spending variances along with a detailed plan and timeline describing how their allocation will be spent.

July 1

Starting July 1, OneWA will require agencies reflect spending monthly (actuals, accruals or encumbrances) and not wait until the end of the fiscal year to process JVs and spend down funding. One Washington leadership, WaTech and legislative staff are looking at the monthly LSR reports which includes spending allocations. We have a collective responsibility to report timely and act to best utilize the \$65 million dollar investment.

July 15 (FM12 close)

- Complete allotments. There are still a few agencies that have allocations in unallotted.
- clean up allotments from 6T1 and move to 6V0.
- Move expenditures from 6T1 to 6V0.
- Agencies who have determined they won't need their full LSR funding allocation should contact Sharon Shields and Alisa Weld to return the funding as soon as possible.

Not setting up allotments or reporting expenditures regularly may result in a reduction in allocation.

25-27 Budget Instructions

The focus for the 2025-27 One Washington budget request is planned to include:

- 1) Phase 1A Core Financials Stabilization,
- 2) Phase 1B Expanded Financials and Procurement planning, requirements and design and
- 3) Phase 2 Human Capital Management and Payroll planning, requirements and design.

In scope: If your agency system(s) being remediated specifically related to One Washington administration functionality (budget, finance, procurement, human resources/payroll), please refer to the One Washington technology pool instructions on the AST SharePoint.

Out of scope: If your agency's system(s) upgraded or modernized are outside the scope of One Washington functionality (budget, finance, procurement, human resources/payroll), please refer to chapter 10 in the budget instructions.

Instructions: All One Washington-related budget requests, which include agency remediation requests, must be submitted to One Washington to be considered for inclusion in the consolidated enterprise-wide One Washington decision package.

One Washington will provide up to date information regarding remediation funding criteria, phase functionality and anticipated systems to be remediated 2025-27 biennium in late June to project teams and fiscal staff.

One Washington is not currently planning on submitting a decision package for fiscal year 2025. If we do need to ask for additional resources, it would only be for LSR Funding/Tech Pool.

Based on the current spending, it does not appear that agencies need funding beyond the \$65 million investment that has already been made.

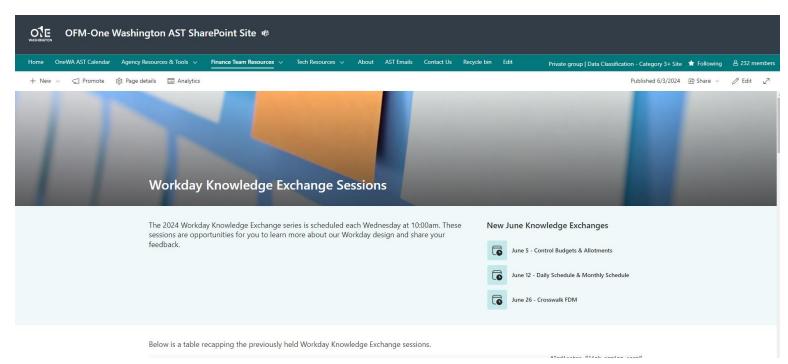
