Project Summary

The Office of Correction Ombuds (OCO) seeks funding for tenant improvements in the OCO suite located in the Helen Sommers Building. These tenant improvements will meet OCO's data sharing agreement with the Department of Corrections. It will also improve the functionality of staff's physical space.

Project Description

Opportunity or Challenge:

The Office of Corrections Ombuds has a Data Sharing Agreement (DSA) with the Department of Corrections (DOC) that has specific protocols for access, maintenance, and destruction of records. The OCO office space has to be secured in order to comply with the DSA requirements. Tenant improvements will create a dedicated hotline space, a separate entrance to maintain the confidentiality of work and records, and improve sound attenuation between the OCO space and other suites in the building.

Consequences of not Funding:

The OCO moved into the current suite in December 2022, and since that time has adapted and modified their work styles out of necessity. Without additional funding for tenant improvements, the OCO can't make the necessary modifications to comply with their DSA. They will continue to have limited space within the suite for confidential conversations.

Background:

The Office of the Corrections Ombuds provides opportunities for people impacted by incarceration to raise issues and resolve conflicts. They work to reduce harm in the corrections system by negotiating outcomes, recommending positive change, and reporting individual and systemic concerns.

Equity Impacts:

Community outreach and engagement:

OCO staff have frequently discussed modifications and improvements to their office space. The OCO staff includes people with the lived experience of incarceration, and we are committed to using trauma responsive reflection in our ombuds work within our community and within our small agency.

Disproportional Impact Considerations:

We do not believe that targeted populations will be excluded by making these tenant improvements to our state-owned suite.

Target Populations or Communities:

The OCO's role to assist in strengthening procedures and practices that lessen the possibility of actions occurring within the Department of Corrections that may adversely impact the health, safety, and welfare of incarcerated individuals. By improving the physical space, in which we do the majority of our work, the OCO staff will be better positioned to provide assistance to the people we serve.
