Background

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Washington state agencies rapidly implemented broad-scale telework for all employees whose job duties did not require on-site presence. This dramatic shift in state government operations proved to be successful and spurred questions about how much physical space state agencies would require in the future. To better understand where the state could be more efficient in its facilities portfolio, the Legislature directed the Office of Financial Management to identify opportunities to reduce leased office space in the 2021-23 operating budget (Chapter 334, Laws of 2021).

Section 131(7) of the budget states:

- (7)(a) The office of financial management statewide leased facilities oversight team must identify opportunities to reduce statewide leased facility space given the change in business practices since 2020 whereby many state employees were mostly working remotely and may continue to do so going forward, or at least more state employees are anticipated to work remotely than in calendar year 2019.
 - (b) The office of financial management will work to identify opportunities for downsizing office space and increased collocation by state agencies, especially for any leases that will be up for renewal effective July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2024.
 - (c) The office of financial management must, in collaboration with the department of enterprise services, identify and make recommendations on reduction in leased office space by agency for fiscal years 2024 and 2025. The analysis must include detailed information on any reduced costs, such as lease contract costs, and include at least:
 - (i) Agency name;
 - (ii) Lease contract number and term (start and end date);
 - (iii) Contract amount by fiscal year; and
 - (iv) Current and future projected collocated agency tenants.
 - (d) The office of financial management must submit a report responsive to (a), (b), and (c) of this subsection to fiscal and appropriate policy committees of the legislature by June 30, 2022.

Current state

OFM is currently developing the 2023-29 Six-Year Facilities Plan (RCW 43.82.055), which is due to the Legislature by January 1, 2023. As part of the office re-entry process, agencies are refining telework policies and hybrid work environment plans, which will inform their long-term physical space needs. Agencies are also aligning their policies with OFM's updated Space Use Guidelines, which support the state's target of 80% daily utilization of workspaces and a baseline goal of three mobile workers to one unassigned workspace.

This report is based on leased office space data from the 2021-27 Six-Year Facilities Plan cycle and takes into consideration current telework utilization and draft agency plans for the 2023-29 planning cycle. To meet the reporting requirements, OFM focused on leases with an end date between fiscal years 2023 and 2025. OFM's analysis excludes legislative and judicial agencies, higher education

institutions, and agencies in the functional group Education¹. Raw data and summary tables are available in Excel format on OFM's <u>Facilities Oversight and Planning</u> web page under "Special projects."

Leased office space

The tables below summarize the total square footage and cost of expiring leased office spaces by fiscal year and functional group. Full-service cost includes base rent and operating costs. Refer to the raw data on OFM's website for lease contract details.

Existing leased collocations

The statewide portfolio currently includes 79 collocated agency leases expiring within the analysis period. These leases represent 25 agencies and are housed within 34 facilities. Refer to Appendix A for a list of collocations by facility.

Telework participation

Per the State HR Modern Work Environment Dashboard, the fiscal year 2022 telework eligibility rate² for all executive branch agencies was 47.6%, with a participation rate³ of 23.7%, as of April 30, 2022.

Planned portfolio reduction

The Department of Enterprise Services is currently projecting 278,590 square feet⁴ of planned office space reduction for leases with an end date between fiscal years 2023 and 2025.

Based on draft agency plans for the 2023-29 six-year planning cycle, OFM sees a consistent trend of downsizing across the portfolio and projects a decrease in square footage of at least 20%.



Recommendations

The charts below show potential reductions in square footage and cost by fiscal year for leased office spaces expiring between fiscal years 2023 and 2025. Additionally, refer to Appendix B for a breakdown of potential cost savings by agency and fiscal year.





Based on planned portfolio reductions, OFM's updated space use guidelines, and current telework utilization, OFM recommends that agencies work toward a baseline 20% portfolio reduction target, as appropriate to business need, by focusing on the following three steps:

- 1. Backfill all owned spaces with current agency staff.
- 2. Consolidate staff within leased and owned agency spaces to reduce full leases.
- 3. Report all available and vacant space monthly in FPMT⁵ for potential collocation opportunities.

⁵ The Facilities Portfolio Management Tool (FPMT) is the system of record for Washington's inventory of state-owned and leased facilities.

Additionally, OFM will work with agencies to:

- Capture current state during the 2023-29 Six-Year Facilities Plan cycle, including updating crucial planning data in FPMT and HRMS⁶.
- Define each agency's hybrid work environment goals and business needs.
- Report on variance from space and cost reduction targets.
