I am writing to rescind the allocation I approved for the University of Washington from Disaster Response Account-Federal for \$1,866,000 on June 29, 2020.

We have determined it is more appropriate for the University of Washington to apply for expedited FEMA-Public Assistance reimbursement for \$1,866,000 from the Military Department through an interagency agreement. If you have not already done so, please contact the Military Department as soon as possible. OFM Accounting staff will contact your staff to help correct your fiscal year 2020 accounting entries.

Please submit the required allotment amendment packet to OFM using the "Operating Allocation" packet type to reflect the rescinded allocation. For Disaster Response Account-Federal, use expenditure authority code 8AO.
