



Business Process Mapping (BPM) Functionality Talking Points

DESCRIPTION	Brief talking points about the BPM tool that describe what the tool is, what it contains, and how it can help agencies understand their current and future state processes.
PURPOSE	These talking points are meant to help agency POCs and budget SMEs understand what the BPM tool is, how it was created, and how it can help agencies complete their OneWa-related budget requests.
AUDIENCE	Agency POCs and budget SMEs

Key Talking Points:

- The goal of the business process mapping (BPM) effort is to help OneWa and agencies better understand the future state of Washington systems and processes and to map current functionality and terminology to the future state functional processes of the project.
- The BPM tool will eventually combine input from the five administrative business functions, including finance, procurement, budget, human resources, and payroll, to provide a visual representation of relationships between the functional areas and processes supported, however the focus of the tool right now is on Phase IA, finance and procurement.
- The BPM tool will help agencies, stakeholders, and business owners understand how current processes may be impacted by an ERP solution in the future. It serves as a data point to consider when developing agency specific OneWa 2021-23 budget requests, technology roadmaps, considering modernization strategies, and evaluating budget proposals for IT investment.
- Current process impact by an ERP solution can be viewed by selecting a business process from the diagram and selecting the “View Details for...” link on the right, below the process description. Currently, only business process for the finance business areas have been mapped to future state ERP capabilities.
