# CONSERVATION EDUCATION PROGRAM SPECIALIST 2 Abolished Initially Effective January 13, 2006 Abolished Final Effective February 10, 2006

<u>Definition</u>: Develops and/or manages the Conservation Education/Information and/or Hunter Education Program for the Department of Game.

<u>Distinguishing</u> <u>Characteristics</u>: Positions allocated to this level have statewide program responsibility and/or supervise Conservation Education Program Specialist 1 level position(s).

## Typical Work

Plans, coordinates and develops divisional Community Affairs Programs in assigned statewide area ensuring program and policy adherence by Conservation Education Program Specialists;

Coordinates the statewide direction of either the Community Affairs Program, the Hunter Education Training Program or the Environmental Education Program;

Supervises department personnel, volunteers or student interns working in department environmental and/or hunter education programs; supervises distribution of information/education material;

Consults with educators, youth groups, wildlife organizations and departmental personnel to plan wildlife related environmental education media, activities, programs, curriculum and study areas;

Creates and develops learning packages, teaching and training aids; researches, selects, writes and photographs material for media production; serves as media production leader;

Provides data on wildlife/environment to teachers and other leaders; reviews current media/materials and recommends **use to** Superintendent of Public Instruction, schools, youth groups, wildlife organizations and department personnel;

Locates funding sources and prepares proposals for funding from Federal or private sources;

Evaluates needs and prepares pre-audit and budget requests;

Performs other work as required.

## Knowledge and Abilities

Knowledge of: principles of learning; teaching methods/procedures; environmental interdependence and interaction; environmental problems and management alternatives; resource management techniques; nature and function of human behavioral patterns; communicating feelings, beliefs and facts.

Ability to: manage learning in children/adults; manage people, manage programs, including planning, organizing, staffing, directing and controlling; analyze problems, make decisions and communicate.

## Minimum Qualifications

A Bachelor's degree in communications, journalism, education, wildlife or fisheries management or related field.

#### AND

Two years of professional experience in environmental education, communications, education, public information, community affairs or related work.

Additional qualifying experience may be substituted, year for year, for education.
