

Specification for Class of

YOUTH CORPS CREW SUPERVISOR - ECOLOGY

Abolished Initially Effective January 13, 2006

Abolished Final Effective February 10, 2006

Definition: Within the Department of Ecology Youth Corps, supervises and works with a crew of up to five teenagers or young adults involved in litter control, recycling activities, and distributing program-related materials at special events. Educates youth crews in the environmental ethics of recycling and litter control.

Typical Work

Supervises median crew activities;

Transports self and crew to and from work locations via assigned vehicle;

Adheres to safety setup procedures and guidelines contained in the Ecology Youth Corps Supervisor's Manual;

Operates and maintains assigned vehicle;

Completes paperwork in a neat, accurate, and timely fashion;

Cooperates with Department of Transportation (DOT) in cleaning median and utilizing DOT-owned equipment;

Recycles all recyclable materials found during cleanup activities and ensures equal division of proceeds between all crew members;

Maintains adequate supplies and materials inventory;

Performs other work as required.

Minimum Qualifications

Graduation from high school or G.E.D. equivalent.

AND

Two years of supervisory or lead experience working with youth.

Two years of college-level course work in social sciences, education, resource conservation or related field will substitute, year for year, for required experience.

NOTE: A valid driver's license is required. For some positions an intermediate endorsement on the driver's license is required.
