# MUSEUM/GALLERY MANAGER Abolished Effective February 10, 2006

### BASIC FUNCTION

Provide the day-to-day operational and administrative management of a museum or gallery.

### **DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS**

With delegated authority, have responsibility for planning, organizing, executing, controlling and evaluating activities, subfunctions and functions of an organization including budget, policies, procedures and staff supervision.

#### TYPICAL WORK

Manage accession, preservation, cataloging, identification and maintenance of the collections;

Prepare cost estimates and projections of future needs and effect proposed actions; review budget requests and provide advice on expenditures; audit and approve expenditures, requisitions, and vouchers;

Supervise curators, docents, graduate students and other employees in duties related to construction, installation, budgetary matters, security and maintenance of exhibits;

Train, supervise, and work with museum/gallery volunteers;

Conduct special studies connected with collections and exhibits; may prepare scholarly papers resulting from studies;

Supervise and train Preparators in techniques of packing, unpacking and shipping of material to ensure safety and security;

Evaluate damage on incoming and outgoing items; process insurance forms and followup on any claims;

Work with faculty in providing information to schools and other visiting groups;

Plan, design and execute exhibits;

Work with Director in scheduling and planning of annual program;

Prepare and maintain administrative and business records;

Prepare grant or contract proposals in compliance with granting agencies' policies;

Represent museum/gallery at professional meetings;

Act in Director's absence;

Perform related duties as required.

### MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

A Bachelor's Degree in Art, History, Science or a related field <u>AND</u> four years of experience as a curator, including experience training and directing museum/gallery workers

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a Master's Degree in Art, History, Science or a related field <u>AND</u> two years of experience as a curator, including experience training and directing museum/gallery workers <u>OR</u> equivalent education/experience.
