BEAUTICIAN 1

Abolished Effective June 1, 2005

Definition: Shampoos, waves hair and performs beauty culture work for residents in institution.

Typical Work

Shampoos, cuts, rinses, dries, and waves hair; gives permanents, hot oil treatments, facials, and manicures; removes superfluous hair;

Mixes shampoo formula; observes scalp and skin conditions and reports unhealthy conditions to supervisor; performs scalp and hair treatments based on medical advice received;

Observes precautions to prevent injury to patients and students;

Sterilizes tools; maintains equipment; keeps shop clean and sanitary;

Instructs patients and students in beauty care and personal appearance;

Orders, stores, and safeguards linens and supplies; maintains simple records;

Performs other work as required.

Knowledge and Abilities

Knowledge of: methods of equipment, and materials used in beauty culture; aseptic practices and sanitation.

Ability to: perform volume beautician work on students and ambulatory and bed patients; sterilize equipment; maintain shop and keep equipment clean and sanitary.

Minimum Qualifications

A valid Washington State Cosmetologist license is required.
