BEAUTICIAN 2

**Abolished Effective June 1, 2005**

Definition: Manages an institution beauty shop, may supervise Beautician 1, and performs beauty culture work for residents in an institution.

Typical Work

Schedules appointments for a beauty shop or beautician work to be done elsewhere in institution;

Shampoos, cuts, rinses, dries, and waves hair; gives permanents, hot oil treatments, facials, and manicures; removes superfluous hair;

Mixes shampoo formula; observes scalp and skin conditions and reports unhealthy conditions to supervisor; performs scalp and hair treatments based on medical advice received;

Observes precautions to prevent injury to patients and students;

Sterilizes tools; maintains equipment; keeps shop clean and sanitary;

Instructs patients and students in beauty care and personal appearance;

Orders, stores, and safeguards linens and supplies; maintains simple records;

Performs other work as required.

Knowledge and Abilities

Knowledge of: requisitioning supplies; methods, equipment, and materials used in beauty culture; aseptic practices and sanitation.

Ability to: supervise beauticians; perform volume beautician work on students, and ambulatory and bed patients; sterilize equipment; maintain shop and keep equipment clean and sanitary.
