SUBJECT: Section 95.10, Federal Assistance Reporting Policies and Procedures

We have revised Section 95.10, Federal Assistance Reporting Policies and Procedures, in the *State Administrative and Accounting Manual* (SAAM), effective June 1, 2022. These changes reflect the modifications to federal audit clusters included in the *2022 OMB Compliance Supplement*, which is effective for fiscal year 2022 reporting.

Key changes in Section 95.10:

- Added Assistance Listing Number (ALN) 10.582 Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program to the Child Nutrition Cluster.
- Removed ALN 10.579 *Child Nutrition Discretionally Grants Limited Availability Program* from the Child Nutrition Cluster to program not clustered.
- Removed ALN 17.804 *Local Veterans' Employment Representative Program* from the Employment Service Cluster to program not clustered.
- Removed the following programs from the Highway Safety Cluster to programs not clustered:
 - o ALN 20.601 Alcohol Impaired Driving Countermeasures Incentive Grants.
 - ALN 20.602 Occupant Protection Incentive Grants
 - o ALN 20.609 Safety Belt Performance Grants
 - o ALN 20.610 State Traffic Safety Information System Improvements Grants
 - o ALN 20.612 Incentive Grant Program to Increase Motorcyclist Safety
 - o ALN 20.613 Child Safety and Child Booster Seat Incentive Grants
- Changed title of ALN 93.045 from *Nutrition Services and CARES Act for Nutrition Services Under Title III-C of the Older Americans Act* to *Special Programs for the Aging, Title III, Part C. Nutrition Service.*
- Changed title of ALN 20.237 *High Priority Grant Program* to *Motor Carrier Safety Assistance High Priority Activities Grants and Cooperative Agreements.*
- Renamed Foreign Food Aid Donation Cluster to Food For Peace Cluster.
